

Proposed reopening of school from the earliest of 1st June for pupils in Nursery, Reception, Year One and Year Six

Thank to all the parents and carers that have got in touch to confirm the return of their children on Monday 1st June. This has allowed us to plan for, seating plans and reducing the number of children in each of our bubbles. If you are planning to bring your child to school on Monday 1st June and you have not contacted school, can I ask that you do this immediately.

- Year Six -8.50-9.00am
- Year Two/ Three key workers and vulnerable groups- 8.50-9.00am
- Year Four/ Five key workers and vulnerable groups- 8.50-9.00am
- Year One -9.05-9.15am
- Reception -9.20-9.30am

Full details of the arrangements are on our school website. For the safety of everyone please make time to read through the letter that fully outlines arrangements.

We are asking children that are returning to wear school uniform **if possible**, however we are very aware that children may have grown since March and purchasing new uniform will have been tricky. Please do not worry if your child is not in full uniform.

New 'Special Golden Rules'

On return to school we have some new 'Special' Golden rules. These are on the next page of the newsletter. Please take time to read through them with your child. We will be spending some time teaching them to the children on their return.

In the event that there is significant change in Governmental policy regarding pupils return to school we will post any changes on the school website.



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Our Special Rules for Returning to School











Do not touch anyone. You're allowed to give yourself a hug though!

Use your own equipment on your table. Do not touch other people's tables or equipment.

Never put equipment in your mouth.

Always stand 2m apart. When lining up, look for the markings on the floor or use your arm in front of you to leave a space. Sing 'Happy Birthday' twice whilst you wash your hands for 20 seconds. Do this regularly, throughout the day.

Always stay with your own bubble. Do not go near other bubbles.

Blow your nose, using a tissue. Bin it immediately. Then wash your hands thoroughly.

Cough or sneeze into your elbow.

Try not to touch your face.

Tell an adult immediately if you feel unwell.

The next steps for us from the 1st June

As you are aware, some year groups have been invited back to school (N, R, Y1 and Y6).

From the 1st June, for those children not returning to school:-

Mrs Wall will continue to place work on Tapestry for Nursery and Reception. Miss Wall will continue to upload work on e-schools for Reception and Nursery where requested.

Miss Gloag will post home learning materials for Year 1.

Mrs Turner will be posting work for Y2 from the 1st June.

Mrs Holme will continue to post work for Y3/4.

Miss Wilson will be posting work for Y5 and for the Y6 children who are not back at school. Also, Miss Wilson is supporting some planning for Y6 within school.

Mrs Turner will be preparing some work for Y6 and answering your Home Learning questions.

Again, the web sites we will give you to look at are so that you have a choice in what you do. After half term, we are going to be placing some more English writing tasks on (punctuation and then some written work).

The Home Learning Team are also going to try and create some lessons on line and we will get back to you on the content of these

We will also look into trying to think about having the option to submit some pieces of work.

We hope everyone has a lovely half-term. No work will be set during this period. However, do not forget to practise for the World Record attempt on TTRS. Miss Holme will remind you of the date to submit your entries closer to the time.
