On behalf of our fabulous team of staff at TCP we are honoured and proud to be nominated as a Hambleton Hero!

To us it is not just been our job it's our passion to support our pupils and families especially during the chaos and uncertainty that came with lockdown. When the world seemed to stop and the schools closed, our dedicated staff worked harder and under more pressure than maybe ever before.

We resorted to a small bubble of staff working within school with the remainder at home juggling their own family needs and setting up remote learning, planning and keeping in regular contact with their pupils and families. We all had to adapt to a new way of working, losing the physical contact with others, the buzz and excitement of the classroom and feeling the isolation of home working. We missed the children, the staffroom chatter and face to face contact but it didn't stop us from continuing to support each other to continue to push to making a difference to the children in our care.

We realized that leading and supporting our pupils and families in a virtual world is challenging but not impossible. Extra effort was taken to remain connected with everyone in meaningful ways to sustain the relationships with pupils, families and colleagues and keep things moving forward.

With a lot of the school deserted for what seemed like forever, it was brought back to life by the team of staff still coming in to support key worker staff and vulnerable children. The sunny weather meant time outside, staff who were not classroom based found ways to spend their time revamping classrooms, sorting cupboards, painting walls and brightening up our school in the anticipation of welcoming our children back to our lovely school.

One of our staff highlights during lockdown was creating a video of the 'blinding lights 'challenge. Every member of staff performed in a dance montage to show to our pupils and be able to see our smiling faces, being a bit silly and letting them know we missed them! We know this was a big hit even though some of us may have slightly embarrassed ourselves with our not so cool moves!!

We recognized that not everyone is technologically confident or even has access to this, so where possible we found ways to still engage and communicate with these families. We met the demands that were directed at us to keep things running smoothly whilst showing kindness and empathy to those finding it more difficult than others.

In a time of uncertainty we were certain of one thing, stick together, keep strong ties with our families, follow the guidelines and protocols and keep safe. This year has shown us the true value of a good team, shouldering new responsibilities and workload whilst remaining professional and upbeat. Every member of Thirsk Community Primary School's team has shown such dedication in keeping the school running with optimism we would be reunited soon. From the Headteacher, teachers, teaching Assistants, office staff, kitchen staff, caretaker and volunteers we have each played a part in offering kindness and support where needed. Some days felt long and the school bell did not ring but the usual standards of care, professionalism and respect were maintained! For us it was business as usual
