A questionnaire went out to families to assess any barriers for home learning so we can address and support you as much as possible. We will provide a range of options to enable access to high-quality learning for all publis. If there have been changes to your circumstances since returning the questionnaire please get in touch with the school office as soon as possible.

What is expected? Work will be uploaded onto Tapestry by Mrs Wall each day at 9 am. This will consist of Phonic and Math work. There will be a Teaching Video and then a follow up task for you and your child to complete at home.

There will also be additional projects around the wider curriculum which links to the children's current class Topic, these are based on a focus story. On some occasions there will be work support Topic uploaded to Schools for you to downiload.

Submitting work

The content of the online lessons will be new learning so teachers will require work to be submitted. This is for two reasons. 1. To assess if the children will need any extra support and input on return to school 2. To ensure the children are receiving regular feedback during the closure.

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What is expected? Work will be uploaded daily onto eSchools under the class page. The Children will log on using their eSchools password which has been stuck into their reading records and attached to this

letter. Each day there will be a Maths and Literacy lesson, these will be taught from the class teacher via a pre-recorded video with consolidation work being attached. The content will be new learning following on from the day the bubble was isolated. There will also be additional projects each day around the wider curriculum which links to the children's current class Topic There is also the option of collecting work from the school office and that has been highlighted from the questionnaire responses.
