#### Maths

In Maths we will continue to build on the children's knowledge and understanding of numbers - this term we will focus on numbers 13-20. We will also explore adding and subtracting one digit numbers.

# Literacy

Phonics continues to be a high priority in class. Daily lessons recap over the speed sounds that have been learned so far, along with the developing skill of blending consonants at the beginning and end of words. Correct formation of all letters continues to be a big focus, along with the quick correct spelling of simple words.

#### Show and Tell

This term the Show and Tell themes are (week beginning):

11.3.19	Number 13
18.3.19	Something that can be weighed
25.3.19	Number 15
1.4.19	Something that can be filled
8.4.19	Something to measure with

It really helps your child's confidence if they have practised a sentence or two about what they have bought and why. Your child's Show and Tell day is Tuesday or Thursday (please make sure the object is small enough to fit in their book bag). Thank you.
