

Two of our pupils took part in the cluster x-country on 11th feb where they ranked in the top 6 against over 360 children. This meant they then went on to Queen Marys on 21st feb to run against the other cluster winners. Both girls were amazing with one winning and one gaining third place.

The girls then progressed to the North Yorkshire School Games Cross Country (XC) Finals at Dalby 'The Great Yorkshire Forest' on the 26th march, All the runners qualified through their local Level 2 School Games events, with only the top 8 from each district qualifying from each year group - so it really was the cream of the crop competing at these finals! It was a windy day up at Adderstone Field, but the sunshine made an appearance and we saw some extremely tight racing.
