He is known especially for his distinctive line drawings with their clever caricature, fascinating detail and often enchanting fantasy elements! As a child, Chris admired the work of John Tenniel, the first illustrator of Alice in Wonderland, and E H Shepard, the illustrator of The Wind in the Willows and Winnie the Pooh. His interest in drawing was encouraged by his mother, when she gave him a paper and pen to keep him quiet during his vicar father's sermons! Chris has worked widely with a variety of collaborators: Paul Stewart on the Muddle Earth, Edge Chronicles and Wyrmweald series; Neil Gaiman on The Graveyard Book, and Russell Brand on Trickster Tales. Most Popular Books



The Home Page includes a Star Review segment, a Featured Author section, Post-it style notelets that feature word of the day, and a fact of the day.

It features real-life authors in the flesh talking about their books, and if pupils want to find a particular author then Who's Next? will help you. The Trending box contains words, authors and titles that are the most searched and at the foot of the page you will find a collection of the 100 most popular books to click on and read. Pupils can even search the most popular books at our school!

Pupils at home can have, take a guiz, write a review, watch an author video as well as make their own.

Mrs Wall, our Reading Lead, will be 'shouting out' any new reviews added by our pupils during the weekly Reading Assembly – which all children will have access to.
